
In response to the growing needs of Loudon County and the surrounding area, in 2023 the hospital and Covenant Health began plans to expand the intensive and intermediate care services available to our patients, as well as increase our emergency department capacity. The Brethen Foundation, led by Loudon County residents Colleen and David Brethen, generously partnered with the hospital to bring this expansion to life. A groundbreaking ceremony was held in November 2023 and construction work is underway.

Now other generous individuals and organizations have the opportunity to join the Brethens and support this expansion and increased level of care to meet the healthcare needs of our community.
